Architectural Style Craftsman

The two-story tall side gable with the side-facing porch recessed under the second floor which creates an unusual massing for the Craftsman style. The exposed rafter tails, triangular brackets in the gable, and the projecting bay at the second floor of the north elevation are characteristic of the Craftsman Style, as are the heavy porch pillars and shingle siding. Based on a historic photo this is not the original cottage on this lot.

Significant Features

- The asymmetrical façade with the porch recessed under the second floor, the square porch columns have recessed panels and are in the Doric style. The massing is somewhat unusual for the Craftsman style.
- The shingle siding, projecting second floor bay with shed roof, exposed rafter tails and paired brackets, along with the exposed rafter tails and triangular wood brackets in the main roof eaves are Craftsman style elements.
- Although the windows do not appear to be original they appear to replicate the original window configuration.

Condition

The cottage is in good repair with no obvious condition issues.
