Architectural Style Dutch Colonial Revival

The two-story cottage has narrow clapboard siding at the first floor and shingle siding at the second floor, the materials and form influenced by the earlier Shingle style. The Doric columns originally on the front and south side porch have been replaced with Doric pillars. The railing between the columns appears to be the original. A portion of the front porch has been enclosed on the south. The windows appear to have been replaced but replicate the original multi-pane upper sash.

Significant Features

- Narrow clapboard and shingle siding.
- Gambrel roof with cornice returns.
- Wrap around front and south side porches.
- Shed roof dormer with multi-pane windows.
- Nine over one window configuration (replicated with new windows).

Condition

The cottage is in good repair no issues are apparent and most of the original features have been retained or replicated.


