Architectural Style Shingle style

The gambrel front roof with cross gables clad in shingles that overhang the first floor creating a wrap-around porch supported by Doric columns are indicative of the Shingle style. The first floor is clad in board and batten siding and large front window with small panes at the top, as well as the two-over-two windows at the second floor are typical of the era.

Significant Features

- Gambrel roof with steep sides creating a second floor and cross gambrels that overhang the first floor creating a wrap-around porch with Doric columns.
- Multi-sided porch at the northeast corner.
- Vertical board and batten siding clad first floor, shingle clad second floor.
- Front window with small panes at the top, two-over-two windows at the second floor, round vents in the gable peaks.

Condition

The cottage is generally in good repair with no apparent issues.
