Architectural Style Queen Anne

The two-and-half-story cross gable massing of this cottage with its clipped gables and carved vergeboards is indicative of the Queen Anne style. The arched window in the gable ends, diamond pane windows in the west bay, multipane windows in the sleeping porch, and turned posts with decorative brackets on the full-width front porch are also typical of the style.

Significant Features

- Steeply pitched cross gable roofs with clipped gables, brackets supporting the deep overhangs, and carved vergeboards
- Full width front porch with turned posts and brackets.
- Arched windows in the gable ends, diamond pane windows in the west bay, and multi-pane windows in the sleeping porches

Condition

The cottage is generally in good repair with no apparent issues.
