Architectural Style Shingle style

The gambrel roof with a shed roof dormer and windows in the gable ends creating a second floor that overhangs the first floor creating a wrap-around porch is typical of the Shingle style. The house originally had a small shed roof dormer, and less windows in the gable end, and different shingle siding. The first-floor footprint has been expanded but it appears the multi-sided bay window in the southeast corner is original.

Significant Features

- Gambrel roof creating a second story that overhangs the first floor creating a recessed wrap around porch with Doric columns.
- Multi-sided bay window in southeast corner.
- The upper sash of the first-floor windows replicate the historic pattern although the window sizes and location have been altered.

Condition

The cottage is generally in good repair with no apparent issues.
