Architectural Style Queen Anne

The two-story massing with a steeply pitched cross gable roof with clipped gable ends as well as the multi-sided northeast corner tower with multi-sided roof are characteristic of the Queen Anne style. The wrap around front porch and rear porch both have turned posts with brackets, another indicator of the style.

Significant Features

- Steeply pitched cross gable roof with clipped gable ends.
- Multi-sided northeast corner tower with multi-sided roof.
- Wrap around front porch with turned posts and brackets.
- First floor shingle siding appears to be original.
- Round window in east gable may be original.

Condition

The cottage is in good repair with no apparent issues.
