Architectural Style Queen Anne

The gable-front two-and-a-half story cottage has gable dormers on the north and south sides, a northeast corner tower and wrap around porch with stone base supporting paired Doric columns and a railing in between, these items are all characteristic of the Queen Anne style. The Palladian window in the gable front is another common feature. There was originally a second-floor porch with sided knee wall that has been enclosed but retains its knee wall and gable front.

Significant Features

- Steeply pitched gable front roof with deep overhangs and cross gable-front dormers on the north and south sides. The roof across the bottom of the gable fronts.
- Vertical massing emphasized by the three-story corner tower with multi-sided roof.
- Wrap around front porch with stone base supporting paired Doric columns and railing in between.
- Former second floor porch (now enclosed) with solid knee wall and gable front.
- Palladian windows in front and rear gables, diamond pane windows on sides, projecting second floor bay on south side.

Condition

The cottage appears to be in good repair with no apparent issues.
