Architectural Style Queen Anne

The primary roof massing of this one-and-a-half story tall cottage is cross-gable but the multiple peaks and dormers give it a complex roof shape, all characteristic of the Queen Anne style. Other Queen Anne features are the carved vergeboards, brackets, and decorative shingle pattern in the gable ends which also have Palladian inspired windows; the wrap around porch with shingle clad knee wall supporting Doric columns and the roof pediment over the wide front steps; and the narrow vertical siding at the first floor with shingles in the dormers and gable ends.

Significant Features

- Complex roof with steep pitch, numerous gables and dormers, primary massing is cross-gable with carved vergeboards, brackets, decorative shingle pattern, and Palladian inspired window configurations in the gable ends.
- Wrap around front porch with shingle clad knee wall and Doric columns. Pediment in the roof over wide front steps with shingle clad wing walls.
- Narrow vertical siding at the first floor and decorative shingles in the gable ends and dormers.

Condition

The cottage appears to be in good repair with no apparent issues.
