Historic Name Cro' Nest

Year Built 1885

Architectural Style Queen Anne

This two-and-a-half-story cottage has tall massing with steep intersecting gable roofs and corner tower, wrap around front porch with brackets and thin Doric columns are all indicative of the Queen Anne style. Further characteristics include the arched muntin pattern in the first floor windows, and multiple panes in the upper sash of the second floor windows, the clapboard siding at the first floor and shingles in the second floor and dormers, second floor porch with shingle clad knee walls and Doric columns, and the deep eaves with brackets around the entire roofline and below the gable ends.

Significant Features

- Tall massing with steep intersecting gable roofs, northeast corner tower with multi-sided roof, and projecting front gable creating a deep second floor porch with shingle clad wing walls. The roof has deep eaves with brackets, the brackets are repeated across the bottom of the tall gable ends.
- Wrap around front porch with slender Doric columns supporting a shallow hip roof with deep eaves and brackets.
- Clapboard siding at the first floor and shingles at the second floor and in the dormers.
- First floor windows with angled muntin pattern, second floor windows with multiple small panes in the upper sash.
- Recessed porch on the south side and enclosed sleeping porch in the rear second floor.

Condition

The cottage appears to be in good repair with no apparent issues.
