Architectural Style Colonial Revival

The large gambrel front roof with Palladian window in the center, brackets across the bottom of the gable, and wrap around front porch with curved edge, and Doric columns supporting the shallow hip roof with brackets along the eave are characteristic of the Colonial Revival style. The shingle siding at the second floor, narrow clapboarding siding at the first floor, second floor windows with multiple panes in the upper sash, and the first-floor windows with a larger bottom sash and upper sash with multiple panes are all typical for the style.

Significant Features

- Large gambrel front roof with Palladian window in center and brackets along bottom of the gable. West side hip roof dormer and gable front dormer with center brackets at the bottom of the gable. Rear gable front with brackets across the bottom of the gable.
- Wrap around front porch with curved corner, central stair, shingle sided knee walls, Doric columns, shallow hip roof with brackets at eaves.
- Bay window at first floor, windows with larger bottom sash and smaller multi-pane upper sash. Second floor windows with multi-panes in upper sash.
- Narrow clapboard siding at first floor, shingle siding at second floor and in dormers.

Condition

The cottage appears to be in good repair with no apparent issues although the large shrubbery next to house could cause future moisture problems. It retains most of its original appearance.
