Dorothy (Morse) Mudd

Dorothy (Dotty) Mudd's connection to the Belvedere Club began when her grandfather, George Treadway Riddle, rented #226 (present-day Scoular) in 1898 for two summers. Her mother, Clara Riddle (Morse), had the chore of bringing water from the nearby well. Because of the lack of the Club's connection to the city's electricity and water, the family summer home was built on the north side. However, that did not prevent Dotty and her twin sister, Georgia Heitner, from swimming across the trestle channel to attend gang with their older cousin, Barbara Birge Wiseman, who started the girls gang.

A lover of sports, Dotty was on the swim and hockey teams of her St. Louis high school, Mary Institute, making the all-state team in the latter sport. In later years she enjoyed the summer cruises to Georgian Bay and a competitive round of golf, usually ending each day with a swim in Lake Charlevoix.

After a Charlevoix-Walloon Lake courtship, marriage, and the arrival of children, Dotty and Dayton purchased #210 and later #203. Having been raised at a time when a woman's career was her family, Dotty devoted herself to her sisters, husband, children and grandchildren, and delighted in the increasing number of sixth generation Belvederians. Her love for the area was made even greater by the many life-long friends she made; to her that was the beauty of the Belvedere.
