Over the years he also served on several boards including Southwest Bank of St. Louis, Marshall and Ilsley Corporation and Rawlings Sporting Goods Co., Inc. A respected leader in the St. Louis business community Mr. Baur was equally passionate about serving his community. Mr. Baur served on the boards of the St. Louis Regional Commerce & Growth Association, The Arts & Education Council of Greater St. Louis, KETC, the Muny, St. Luke's Hospital and was commissioner emeritus of Tower Grove Park. He also served as Chair of the National Kidney Foundation and has recently been involved with Autism Speaks. Mr. Baur attended Country Day School in St. Louis, received an A.B. degree in 1966 from Washington & Lee University and an M.B.A. from George State University in 1970. He later served as a Trustee of Country Day School, Washington & Lee University and St. Louis University.
