Jollie News Allen, 98, of Kalamazoo, Michigan passed away peacefully on Sunday, January 11, 2015.

Jollie was born July 9, 1916 in Kalamazoo, Michigan, one of four children of Glenn S. Allen and Annette Brenner Allen. He graduated in 1938 from Kalamazoo College where he was captain of the varsity tennis team for four years. He then followed his love of flying by enrolling in the Boeing School of Aeronautics. Upon graduation, he worked for Pan American Airlines during WWII as a meteorologist, stationed in Trinidad and Miami. He married his first wife, Carol Walker, in Miami. They then moved to Kalamazoo to continue the family business, Globe Construction Company. After he and Carol divorced, he met and married Susan Jean Hicks, of Grosse Pointe, MI in 1958. They celebrated their 56<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary last July.

Jollie was an avid tennis player most of his life, but his real passion was the game of golf, which he thoroughly enjoyed playing, particularly on numerous golfing trips with a close group of friends known as the "Hungry Eight."

Allen, was not only a founding member, but designed and built one of the first cottages, lovingly known as the "Bluebell."
